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A DEAF JUSTICE IN THE SUPREME COURT

Did we ever have a deaf justice that served in the Supreme Court?

Sort of, but hard to say. Gabriel Duvall was a Supreme Court justice between 1811 and 1834. Midways during his long term, he became late-deafened.

And very possibly because he was too deaf to hear oral arguments, he rarely expressed an opinion!

To be fair, Supreme Court justices do not get help, be it oral interpreters, CART (possibly not allowed in the hallowed Supreme Court halls) or assistive electronic listening devices (again, possibly not allowed).

At any rate, he stepped down in 1834, citing old age. And there were no such a thing as electronic assistive devices that early in the 19th century.

Why do some hearing people watch captions?
Noisy rooms or wanting to learn English better?
Whatever, but there is another reason.

There are some hearing people that suffer from the Central Auditory Processing Disorder. It means they confuse human voices with background noises. So, all the more reason for them to watch captions.
