Cued Speech is currently used in both oral and total communication environments, according to an article in THE VOLTA REVIEW. At least half of the hearing impaired students who use Cued Speech were described as having severe or profound hearing losses, the survey said.

Dr. Catherine Sheridan Quenin, a Research Associate at Power International in Rochester, NY, and Dr. Ingrid Blood, an Associate Professor of Communication Disorders at The Pennsylvania State University in University Park, PA, conducted the survey of 61 schools and programs in the United States currently using Cued Speech.

The purpose of the survey was to determine usage of cueing in the educational setting as well as the numbers of children served by Cued Speech programs.

The article "A National Survey of Cued Speech Programs" appeared on pages 283-289 in the October/November 1989 issue of THE VOLTA REVIEW, which is the journal of the Alexander Graham Bell Association for the Deaf.

NCSA WRITING CONTEST

Contest Rules:

- A. Contestants must be between the ages of 5 and 17 years.
- B. Contestants must have a profound hearing impairment, as indicated by:
 - 1. Severe to profound sensorineural hearing impairment occurring at or before age two and a half years;
 - 2. Submission of their latest audiogram completed by an ASHA certified (CCC-A) audiologist; and
 - 3. An unaided puretone average (500, 1000 and 2000 Hz) of 80 dB HTL (ANSI 1969) or greater in the better ear.
- C. Contestants must have been using Cued Speech for a minimum of two years.
- D. Contestants must complete the writing contest Registration form.
- E. Contestants must be sponsored by a 1990 NCSA member (parent, teacher, speech pathologist, etc.).
- F. The honor statement on the contest Registration Form must be signed by the contestant and sponsoring NCSA member, verifying that the contestant has received no assistance from anyone in completing his or her entry.
- G. The contestants must submit both their first and final drafts of their entries. Only the final draft will be judged. Initial rough drafts are being requested in order for the judges to ensure that the contestants are the true authors of the entries, and have had no outside assistance.
- H. All entries must deal with the themes of **Family** or **Friends**.
- I. Contestants may make no more than one entry to each literature category (poem and short story).
- J. Entries will be judged in the following age categories: 5-7, 8-10, 11-14, and 15-17 years.
- K. Written entries will be number coded and names removed to maintain objectivity in judging.
- L. National winners in each age and literature category will be announced by June 5, 1990. Formal award presentations will be made at the NCSA Conference July 23, 1990 in Washington, D.C. Winners need not be present at the awards ceremony to collect their prizes. Prizes are to be announced at a later date.

Criteria for Judging:

- A. Standard English syntax and punctuation
Poetic license will be allowed where appropriate in poetry division and within dialogue in short story division.
- B. Standard English spelling
- C. Appropriate word choice
- D. Vocabulary flexibility and maturity for age of contestant
- E. Originality and creativity of material
- F. Thought organization and clear expression of ideas
- G. Appropriate use of metaphor and symbolism
- H. Style
- I. Adherence to theme(s) of "family" and/or "friends"
- J. There are no specified length requirements.
